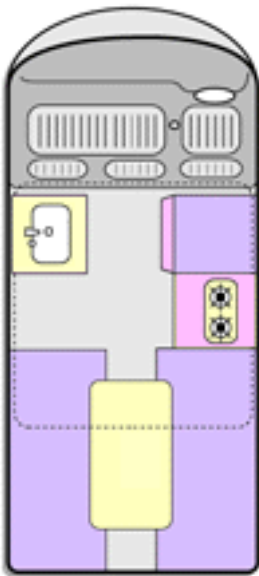
Total \$4690 or \$2345p/p

Your OWN WAY

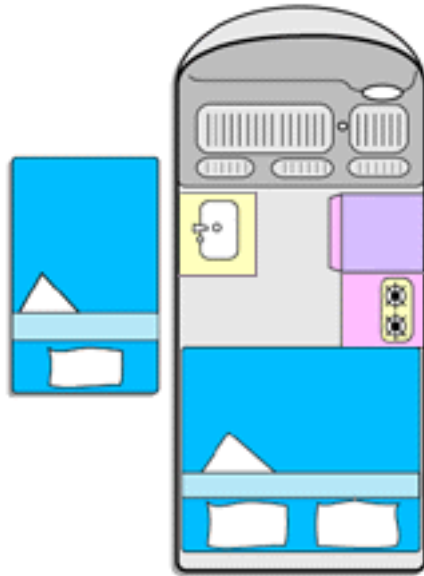
56 Days Camper Rental @ \$70pd \$3920
